Etymology of Violence

From the Latin: *violation* = irreverence, profanation *vis* = force



An act of violence is an attack on human dignity. It is a perverse use of human agency. Violent people are assuming a power over others that they do not have. **Circles of the Violent** – a distinctly different place from the circles of the carnal


- Truly the stuff of nightmares The Harpies




The "Heretics" (not a lot) are those for whom religion was irrelevant to them in their life. They dismissed the idea of eternal life.

Dante the Pilgrim: "If my people were scattered, at least they formed again...unlike yours!"



The irreligious have no sense of "the Big Picture."




Canto XI – More Heretics

The Minotaur - The head of a bull on the torso of a man.

The Violent against their in Circle 7 – Outer Ring

Outer ring – housing the violent against people and property, who are immersed in Phlegethon – a river of boiling blood, to a level commensurate with their sins.



"These were the kings of bloodshed and despoilment... ...the place where tyrants stew." They get to wallow in blood for all eternity.

CANTO XIII

The Violent against themselves Circle 7 – Middle Ring

Middle ring – In this ring are the suicides, who are transformed into gnarled thorny bushes and trees.

*The trees are a metaphor; In life the only way of the relief of suffering was through pain (suicide)

The Suicides

Since the souls have destroyed their own bodies, they are denied a human form.

Catechism of the Catholic Church on Suicide



2281 Suicide contradicts the natural inclination of the human being to preserve and perpetuate his life. It is gravely contrary to the just love of self. It likewise offends love of neighbor because it unjustly breaks the ties of solidarity with family, nation, and other human societies to which we continue to have obligations. Suicide is contrary to love for the living God.

Run naked through the thorny woods pursued by hungry and angry dogs who tear them to pieces and carry off their limbs. Sin: violence of wasting (themselves) CAN

The Violent against GOD, Nature and Art Circle 7 - Inner Ring

Inner ring – All reside in a desert of flaming sand with fiery flakes raining from the sky.

Violent against:

GOD - blasphemers, Nature -Sodomites; Art – Usurers

Latini Brunetto Latini accosts Dante

Raging at God: for His Sovereignty, His order, His decrees for mankind. They get a world without all of it. Empty shadeless sand. "Vanity of vanities."

Blasphemy

Brunetto The Intellectual
